

THE TONY PALMER COLLECTION



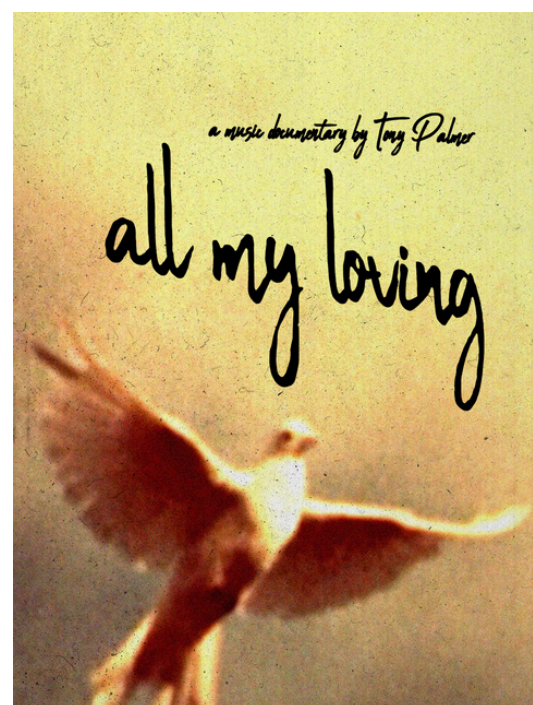
Tony Palmer is an acclaimed filmmaker with a vast body of work spanning over 100 films. His career began with early projects featuring 60s and 70s rock musicians such as The Beatles, Cream, Jimi Hendrix, and Frank Zappa, eventually expanding to portraits of a range of artists such as Benjamin Britten, Igor Stravinsky, Maria Callas, Vangelis, Yehudi Menuhin, André Previn, John Osborne, Athol Fugard, Margot Fonteyn, Leonard Cohen, William Walton, and Renée Fleming. His feature films include *Testimony*, starring Ben Kingsley as Shostakovich, and *Wagner*, a 7-hour 45-minute epic starring Richard Burton, Laurence Olivier, and Vanessa Redgrave, hailed by the Los Angeles Times as “one of the most beautiful films ever made.”

Palmer’s work has earned over 45 international awards, including 14 Gold Medals at the New York Film & Television Festival, BAFTA, EMMY, and GRIERSON nominations, as well as honors from festivals in Jerusalem, San Francisco, São Paulo, Chicago, Sofia, Cuenca, and London. In 1989, the National Film Theatre in London held a major retrospective of his work—the first for an ‘arts’ filmmaker.

Beyond filmmaking, Palmer is a prize-winning opera director, recipient of the Golden Mask in Moscow, three Platinum and two Gold records, and a SONY Prize-winning radio presenter. He is the only filmmaker to have won the prestigious PRIX ITALIA three times and was nominated for the Glenn Gould International Prize in 2014. Additional accolades include the Gold Medal of St. Simeon from the Bulgarian Ministry of Culture, the Outstanding Achievement Award from Hot Docs Toronto (2017), the Stravinsky Prize (2019), and the Tchaikovsky Medal from the National Academy of Music in Kiev.

An honorary Professor of East European Cultural Studies at Lesya Ukrainka University in Ukraine, Palmer also holds honorary doctorates (D.Mus & D.Litt) and is a Fellow of the Royal Geographical Society. Syndicado presents a collection of some of his most esteemed works.
